# The EGE score

**ELAN Geriatric Evaluation** 

is a **new geriatric screening tool** for elderly patients with Head and Neck Cancer squamous cell carcinomas (HNSCC).

# The EGE score: OBJECTIVES

- To early identify the frailty in elderly patients
- To propose a specific treatment adapted to their state of fragility

# The EGE score (ELAN Geriatric Evaluation)

Validated by the Elan Oncoval Study, it must be realised before the initiation of treatment (chemotherapy ou radiotherapy).

The score is done by oncologist ou radiotherapist or a nurse trained in the test.

It allows to screen the patients in two groups:

- Patients FIT who receive a standard treatment
- Patients UNFIT who receive an adapted treatment

# **Mobility Status Evaluation**

## Have you had a fall in the year?

- → YES
- → NO

## Monopodal Station > 4 secondes

- → YES
- → NO

If fall or monopodal station impossible or < 4 sec: The patient is fragile

## **Cognitive Evaluation: Mini-Cog**



#### Instructions to the patient:

1-Three-word registration: « Please listen carefully. I'm going to say three words that I want you to repeat back to me now and try to remember ».

Example: - Banana-sunrise-chair

2-Clock drawing: « I want you to draw a clock for me using this preprinted circle. First put in all of the numbers where they go. Then, when it's completed, set the hands to 10 past 11 ».

Scoring clock draw = 0 or 2 points. Normal clock = 2 points; inability or refusal to draw a clock = 0 points.

3-Three-word recall: « What were the three words I asked you to remember? ».


→Scoring word recall= 0 to 3 points. 1 point for each word spontaneously recalled without cueing.

#### <u>Total Score</u>: (0-5 points) = Word Recall score + Clock Draw score.

→ Frailty if score < 3/5 (A total Score <3 on the Mini-Cog has been validated for dementia screening) If necessary, use the following link: https://www.alz.org/documents\_custom/minicog

#### **Distance/accessibility of services**:

→Very difficult and/or impossible	1
→Some difficulties but helping present at the consultation to verify that it's effective	0 or 1
→No problem	0

## **Quality of means of transport**

→very dimcult and/or impossible	1
→Some difficulties but helping present at the consultation to verify that it's effective	0 or 1
→No problem	0

Social Environment	
→ Loneliness and/or confinement, does not benefit from any potential help	1
→ Insufficient entourage: precarious aid, potentially insufficient requiring support

# Frailty if score ≥ 1

## **Functional Status : ADL (Activities of Daily Living)**

ADL				Scoring:1:independence - 1/2: need some help- 0: dependance
Bathing	0	1/2	1	Bathes self completely or needs help in bathing only a single part of body such as the back
				Gets clothes from closets and drawers and puts on clothes and outer garments complete with fasteners. May have help tying shoes
Dressing	0	1/2	1	
Toileting	0	1/2	1	Goes to toilet, gets on and off, arranges clothes, cleans genital area without help
Transferring	0	1/2	1	Moves in and out of bed or chair unassisted. Mechanical transfer aids are acceptable
Hansiering	U	1/2	1	transfer alus are acceptable
Continence	0	1/2	1	Exercices complete self-control over urination and defecation
Feeding	0	1/2	1	Gets foods from plate into mouth without help. Preparation of food may be done by another person.

# Frailty if the score < 6

## **Comorbidities: Charlson Comorbidity Index**

#### Comorbidities: Updates Charlson Comorbidity Index (updated CCI) (maximum=24)

Circle the item when the patient presents the comorbid condition, and add each point to obtain the total score. Cancer of hematological malignancy has to be scored as well.

Metastatic solid tumor	6 pts
AIDS/HIV	4 pts
Moderate / severe liver disease	4 pts
Any malignancy, including leukemia and lymphoma	2 pts
Mild liver disease	2 pts
Hemiplegia or paraplegia	2 pts
Congestive heart failure	2 pts
Dementia	2 pts
Chronic pulmonary disease	1 pt
Rheumatologic disease	1 pt
Renal disease	1 pt
Diabetes with chronic complications	1 pt

#### Frailty if:

> 2 (without Head and Neck Cancer) for patients > 80 and over

> 3 (without Head and Neck Cancer) for patients aged 70 to 80
